



Coronation of King Charles III

This Notice contains important travel information regarding the Coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla.

A range of ceremonial, celebratory and community events will take place over the Coronation Weekend.

The Coronation service will be held at Westminster Abbey at 11:00 on Saturday 6 May.

The King's Procession will take Their Majesties from Buckingham Palace, along The Mall, through Admiralty Arch, south of King Charles I Island and Trafalgar Square, down Whitehall, Parliament Street, to the east and south side of Parliament Square and into Broad Sanctuary before arriving at the Westminster Abbey.

Following the service, the Coronation Procession will travel back to Buckingham Palace, via the reverse of the above route.

At Buckingham Palace, The King and The Queen Consort, accompanied by Members of the Royal Family, will appear on the balcony to conclude the day's ceremonial events.

In addition, a Coronation Concert will take place at Windsor Castle from 8pm on Sunday 7 May.

Road closures

The roads and parks around central London will be affected by significant road closures and parking suspensions on 5 and 6 May. There will also be some localised, temporary restrictions between 3 April and 15 May.
