In the days ahead London will continue to rely on taxi and private hire services as there are likely to be in excess of a million people coming to the Capital to pay their respects and to attend planned ceremonial events.

There will be road closures in place at locations in Westminster and other temporary changes to respond to and support these events. TfL is working closely with the Metropolitan Police to minimise the disruption of these changes.

Update from Met Police

Policing and security operation under way in London following the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Officers and staff from across the Metropolitan Police Service are deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Following the announcement, the Met, British Transport Police and the City of London Police have initiated well-rehearsed policing plans across the capital.

The public will see additional officers posted outside key locations, including transport hubs, Royal Parks and outside Royal residences in London. We will be keeping people safe with highly visible patrols across London.

Road closures are being established at a number of locations in Westminster. Although we recognise these road closures may cause some inconvenience, they are necessary to ensure the safety of those members of public visiting London and to allow the planned ceremonial events to take place.

The Met is working closely with Westminster City Council and Transport for London to minimise any disruption to residents and businesses. Those wishing to travel into London and visit Royal Residences are encouraged to visit www.Royal.uk for the latest information.
