



Northern Line Extension BI-MONTHLY UPDATE

July-August 2017

Battersea Power Station

Thank you for your patience whilst we continue with the Northern Line Extension (NLE) works near you. We would like to update you on where we are and what is planned for the next couple of months.

What has been completed:

To date we have completed approximately 15% of the station box, this includes excavation. We have installed approximately 60% of the precast beams. Approximately 55% of the station structure has also been completed.

We began excavation works to the ticket hall level of the station (basement level -1), which is currently 30% completed.

Tunnelling is progressing. To date we have installed 170 rings in the southbound tunnel. Both tunnels will require 3,288 rings each to complete. The tunnelling process is consistent; the Tunnel Boring Machines (TBMs) will continue their journey beneath Battersea, Nine Elms and Kennington excavating and installing the tunnel rings. Surface works continue 24/7 at Battersea, with deliveries of tunnel ring segments and removal of excavated material. Barges continue to be scheduled for the removal of material to Goshems Farm in Tilbury.

During May, as part of our ongoing efforts to engage with the local community and youth groups, we hosted a Stakeholder Day on Saturday 20 May. This was attended by the Thiruvalluar Tamil School and residents from the local estates, including Savona and Viridian . The day was greatly received, with the school taking part in activities designed to encourage an uptake in construction as a potential career and residents getting a project update and the opportunity to speak to engineers from the civils and tunnelling team about the work they are doing.

What is planned:

During the next couple of months, we will be bringing in a piling rig onto site, this is a wide load and will require access to site before **07:00**. This rig will be required to install eight piles which will take place during working hours only **08:00** to **18:00** and will last approximately one week in August. The piles will be required for a tower crane being installed on site which will assist with activities on site.

Works on the station box will continue as before, with excavations and installation of precast beams, as well as concrete pours.

Working hours for tunnelling and surface tunnel support are now 24 hours/7 days a week. We do everything we can to minimise night time noisy works. This will include deliveries arriving to site between 07:00 and 20:00 Monday to Saturday and the attendance of barges 24/7 during the tunnelling period to remove excavated material.

We would like to invite you to a new exhibition at The Institution of Civil Engineering on Tunnel Engineering, this is being held at their Grade II listed home in Westminster.
