Existing View

This view is from a point close to the war memorial at the north-western corner of the Grade II registered Kennington Park. The foreground comprises the beginning of a sweeping path which extends eastwards into the background. The foreground also takes-in a grassed, dog exercise area enclosed by railings to the north and a low bow-top fence to the south. This open area is lined by trees to the north which filter views of the two- to three-storey Victorian villas which front Kennington Park Place, some of which are listed. The background of the view includes the tops of earlier listed Georgian townhouses and the Kennington Park Lodge. The latter is substantially screened by dense vegetation within the lodge garden and park. There are also glimpsed views of the 20th century Conant House filtered by mature evergreen trees within the park.

Existing and Proposed

The foreground of this view would be returned to a grassed area enclosed by a low metal fence. Longer grass would be established along the northern boundary of Kennington Park, extending into the middle-ground. This boundary would be reinforced by an avenue of new London Plane (Platanus x hispanica) trees and railings to match the existing. The proposed head house building would fall into the background of the view. The building would be located further to the right than the existing Kennington Park Lodge, and the roofline swept back to reveal a more extensive view of the Grade II listed properties No.s 1-7 St. Agnes Place and their attached railings. Only the louvered west-facing façade of the head house building would be visible, above a dense massing of flowering trees and shrubs which would provide its setting.

The foreground of this view is formed by the junction of Kennington Park Place and St. Agnes Place; residential streets are flanked by narrow pavements with granite kerbs. Kennington Park Lodge, an interwar former park keeper's cottage, forms the focus of the view in the middle-ground. The modest two-storey house faces the corner of the street and is set within a garden enclosed by metal railings. Mature trees and shrubs form the background of the view, within the Grade II registered Kennington Park and to the rear of the lodge. The view to the west extends along Kennington Park Place as far as Kennington Park Road and takes-in the tree-lined northern boundary of Kennington Park.

Existing and Proposed

The middle-ground of this view would be transformed by the proposed community building with the head house to the rear, in place of the existing Kennington Park Lodge. These new high quality buildings, which would be architecturally balanced and complementary in design, would form the focus of the view. Architectural details, such as the intricate green roof form, brick relief and large windows would be readily discernible. The view would be further enhanced by proposed flowering fruit trees, ornamental shrubs and climbing plants within the gardens surrounding the buildings. Plants have been selected to provide visual interest from the street throughout the year. Trees and shrubs within Kennington Park would form the background of the view, framing the proposed buildings. The northern boundary would also be reinforced by an avenue of new London Plane (Platanus x hispanica) trees and railings to match the existing.
