Jill Collis		Yellow is not necessarily the last colour to be seen before loss of colour vision. This is a commonly held myth. Colour vision deficiencies are much more complex. (Yellow/blue colour vision deficiencies are much less common than red/green ones.)  Contrast is generally measured in accessibility standards for the built environment in terms of the difference in the amount of light reflected by each colour. (Known as LRV light reflectance value). The minimum recommended difference in LRV is 30 points. Yellow, white or pale grey combined with black or dark blue/purple/green are good combinations because they have very different LRVs. Black is only a good colour to use if the background it is being used against (in our example escalator steps) is light. Black would not contrast well
