Pipeline projects Intelligent Speed Application (ISA)

In January we announced that AECOM will take over the management and operation of the Fleet Operator Recognition Scheme (FORS) for the next five years, with the option of a two-year extension.

Work Related Road Risk (WRRR)

Businesses working for or on behalf of TfL must improve the safety of their vehicles and adopt the WRRR cycle safety requirements. Failure to meet these could result in vehicles being turned away from sites, with these instances recorded as a failed delivery.

New procurement regulations for 2015

The Public Contracts Regulations 2015 which govern UK public sector procurement were laid before Parliament on 5 February and most came into force on 26 February, 2015, earlier than anticipated. One of the main aims of the changes is to encourage participation from SMEs in tendering exercises.

Significant changes include:

- Minimum turnover required by Contracting Authorities is now capped at twice the value of the tendered contract, unless in exceptional circumstances
- Tender documents will be available from the date of OJEU advertisement – this means no more registering interest and chasing the Contracting Authority for updates
- All contracts over £25,000 will now be advertised on Contracts Finder, unless using a framework or a known list of suppliers. The use of a PQQ stage has also been prohibited for low value contracts
